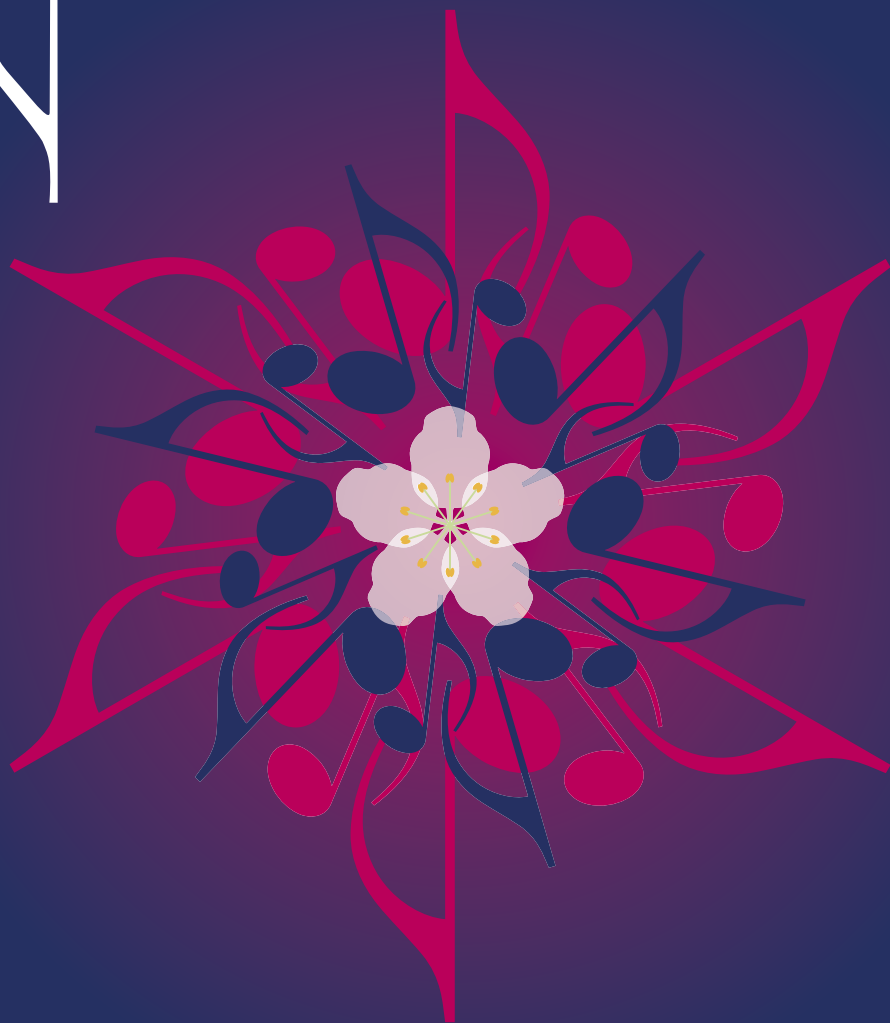

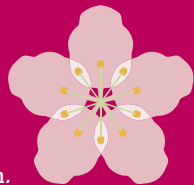

Monday 20th June – Trees and Hedges

Nick Packard, the Trust's Estate Manager, explains the landscape of the Suburb from the early planting to the present bosky character.

Tuesday 21st June – Cottage Plans and Common Sense – Housing the Edwardian

Artisan David Davidson, the Trust's Architectural Adviser, tours the Artisans' Quarter to see how cottages were planned – and what house builders can learn today.

It will end at the Free Church in time for the lunchtime organ recital. Meet at the flag pole, next to Whitestone Pond NW3 7ES.

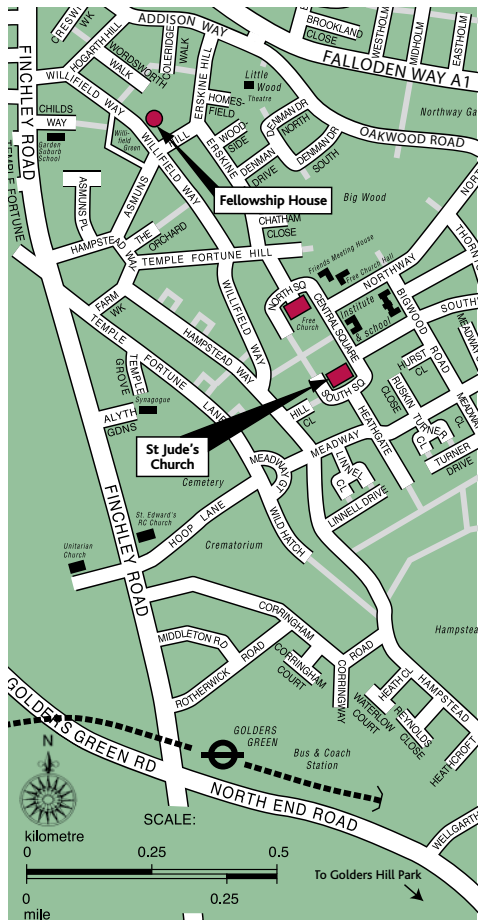

Travel by bus or Northern Line tube to Golders Green station. Then either walk to St Jude's – it takes fifteen minutes – or catch an H2 bus from its terminal by the station in Finchley Road. Get off the bus at Heathgate and you will see St Jude's, 150 yards up the hill.

We are introducing secure online booking this year, which will allow you to select exactly the seats you want from those available. You may still book by post and we will select the best available tickets for you.

Booking periods open as follows:

Gold Friends – Monday 14th March

Silver Friends – Monday 28th March

Bronze Friends – Monday 11th April

General public – Tuesday 26th April

Become a Friend – see back page.

Postal applications will be handled on the same timetable as online booking. Telephone booking will be available only from **Wednesday 1st June**.

All bookings will be subject to a fee of £2 per booking. Returns will be subject to a £5 administration charge per booking.

Online booking – Go to www.promsatstjudes.org.uk and click on **booking**, then follow the instructions. Tickets will be posted to you.

Postal booking – Please complete and post the attached booking form. There is NO need for a stamped addressed envelope, as required in previous years. Tickets will be posted to you.

Paying by cheque? If your first choice is not available but you will accept an alternative for the same event, please send an open cheque with an upper limit.

Telephone Bookings – **Box Office 020 8458 8798** opens from **Wednesday 1st June** 2-6pm every day except Sunday.

Seating – Seating is classified as **Premium A** and **B** (front **A**, rear **B**) and **Unnumbered C**. Premium seating is upholstered, numbered and in the main body of the church. Unnumbered seats are wooden and are placed down the side aisles and at the rear. Some of these seats have restricted views and video screens are

placed to help overcome this, but early arrival is recommended. Cushions are available to hire for £1. Special spaces are reserved for wheelchair users – please indicate when booking if you need one of these.

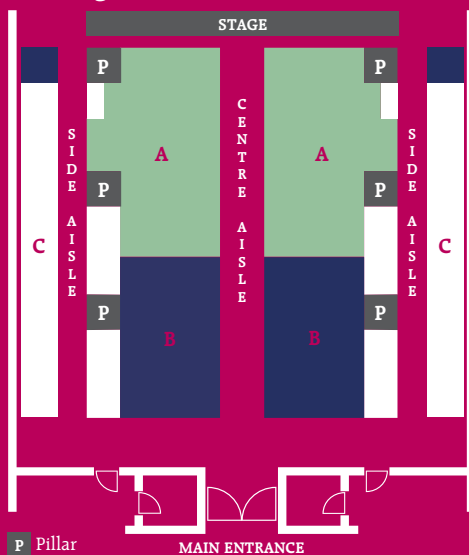
